Bob Adams Launches Bid for West Virginia House

KEARNEYSVILLE, WV- Conservative Republican Bob Adams announced today he is officially a candidate for the West Virginia House of Delegates to represent the 66th legislative district in Jefferson County.

"I'm excited at the opportunity to serve the people of Jefferson County as their state representative in Charleston," said Bob Adams, 46, of Kearneysville. "I look forward to sharing with voters my vision for growing our local economy to create more jobs and greater prosperity for our families."



Adams seeks to replace state Del. Paul Espinosa, who announced last week he would be seeking the Republican nomination for state Senate in 2016.

Adams has a long history of working in Republican politics at both the state and national levels. He began his career in 1994 as a press aide to former Congress J.C. Watts, Jr. (R-OK).

In 2008, Adams was the Republican candidate for state Senate in West Virginia's 16th senatorial district, but narrowly lost by just over 200 votes to Democrat Sen. Herb Snyder.

After the campaign, Adams turned his focus to national politics, where he started a number of successful political organizations. He is currently the President and CEO of Revive America LLC (ReviveUSA.com), a political media and publishing company. He is also the founder of two federal political actions committees, Revive America PAC (RevivePAC.com) and Go Big Go Bold PAC (GoScottGo.com).

In 2014 election cycle, Revive America PAC raised just over \$600,000 in small dollar contributions.

In March of this year, Adams founded Go Big Go Bold PAC to support the presidential bid of Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker.

Adams will graduate with a Masters of Business Administration degree from Shepherd University in August 2015. He earned his B.A. in Mass Communications from Towson University (MD) in 1993.

He is a veteran of the United States Navy, having served on the U.S.S. Gridley (CG-21) in 1988.

Bob Adams resides in Kearneysville with his wife Allison, and four children. In his free time, he enjoys being with his family and running "ultra-marathons".
